## CYNGOR CYMUNED LLANGYNIDR COMMUNITY COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2024-25

This report was written to comply with the Local Government & Elections (Wales) Act 2021.

Llangynidr Community Council had 10 councillors up to May 2025 - 4 Advisory Committees: Planning, HR, Finance and Rights of Way.

The Council has a positive and beneficial relationship with its County Councillor who regularly attends the Community Council meetings and submits a full and compressive monthly report.

Assets are the Public Conveniences, Persondy Field, The tump at Pen Yr Ale Lane, The Old Ford, The path past the walnut tree stores, the river path and the Car Park, no change up to May 2025.

Community engagement exercises were undertaken: Annual parish meeting held with 30 plus residents in attendance. Residents meeting held following landslip in the Dyffryn Crawnon. VE Day Celebration with Afternoon Tea, sing along and attended by the Primary School children's choir. First Aid and Defibrillator training undertaken by the Councillors and residents.

Long term considerations are to implement the speed matrix signs. Maintain the benches and picnic tables alongside the Community Well-Being Group, On-going maintenance of the public toilets. Maintain the trees and hedges on Council property. Support and improve biodiversity enhancements within the car park area and around the village.

Following receipt of windfall funds, the residents opted to purchase speed matrix signs for implementation along the dangerous stretch of the Cwm Crawnon road where pedestrians regularly cross between the car park, bus stops, village hall and playing fields.
