

To bring Councillor up to date; volunteers have undertaken two observations in November, so far:

- November 1st by the Coach & Horses 9.30-10.30am details of 9 vehicles with top speed 33mph, 7 at or over 30mph were captured and shared with GoSafe.
- November 12th by the village Hall 2.30-4pm 29 vehicles top speed 40, 2 at 38mph, 13 at or over 30mph. On this occasion there were 3 volunteers. However one number plate was incorrect; after receiving the letter the driver contacted Dyfed Powys Police advising he had not visited Wales - a police officer contacted me this morning to check.

I learnt from fellow volunteers a team from South Wales Police was educating drivers today, until maybe 1.30pm. I am advised a steady flow of vehicles, were being stopped, parked in the car park on Cwmcrawnon Road, where they were given a questionnaire and a chat with a fireman, adding an additional maybe 10 minutes to their journey time. Good news.

This afternoon from 2pm volunteers observed speeds on Forge Road details of 9 vehicles, 1 a bike at top recorded speed 32mph; before moving at 3pm onto the pedestrian entrance to the car park. By 4pm details of a further 18 vehicles 6 over 30mph were captured, ADSA delivery vehicle was the top recorded speed 37mph. All have been input onto the GoSafe website and we hope details match the police database so most will receive a letter.
We noted several of the secondary school children had laces undone, which could mean they could easily trip into the road. Anyone like a word with the school?
